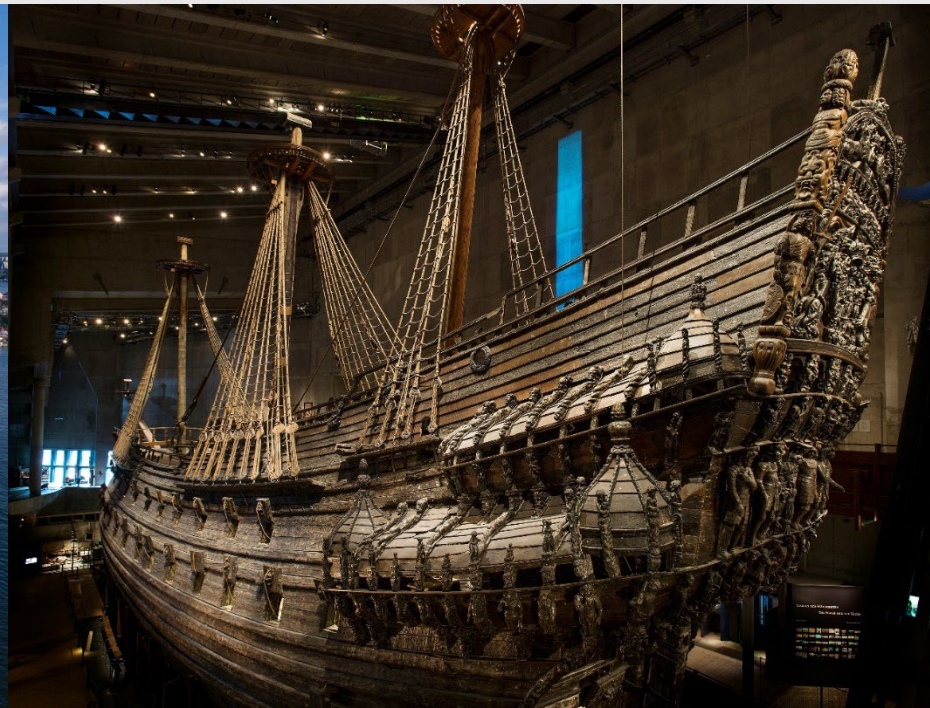
Day 1 | Monday, 18 August

Guided Tour and Vasa Museum

The day starts with bus tour through the heart of Stockholm, passing by iconic landmarks such as Gamla Stan, the Royal Palace, Djurgården. Sit back, relax, and take in the sights as our knowledgeable guide provides fascinating insights into the city's history and culture.

Lunch at Villa Godthem Located on the picturesque Djurgården island, this charming restaurant offers a cozy and elegant ambiance with views of the surrounding parkland. Originally a 19th-century villa, Villa Godthem serves classic Swedish cuisine with a modern twist.

After lunch, we take a short walk to the **Vasa Museum**, where you'll have the opportunity to marvel at the awe-inspiring Vasa warship. Learn about its ill-fated **maiden voyage in 1628**, its remarkable salvage, and the painstaking restoration efforts that brought it back to life.

After lunch, we'll make our way to the **ABBA Museum**, where you'll step back in time to the heyday of **Sweden's most iconic pop group**. Explore interactive exhibits, relive classic ABBA performances, and even try your hand at mixing your own music in the studio.

Gubbhyllan is a restaurant that delivers **artisanal food** in the form of homemade sausages, pickles and ice cream. Even own coffee is roasted here. In short, everything is cooked from scratch.

In addition to their **unique restaurant concept**, they also have Djurgården's largest selection of **artisanal wines**. For those who prefer non-alcoholic drinks, there is also a juice bar.

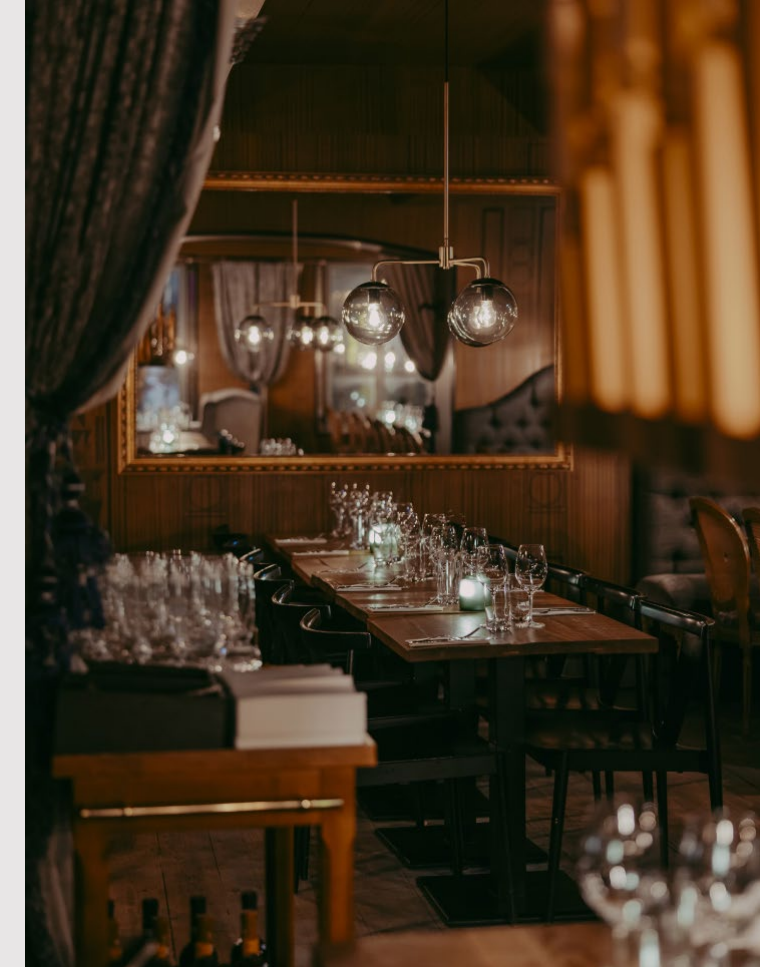
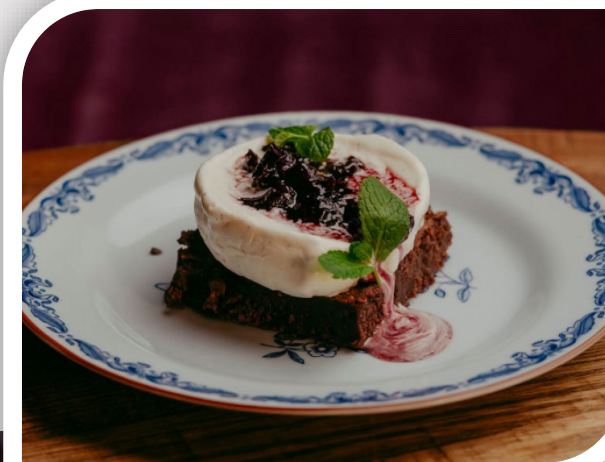
After the tour, enjoy a lunch at Stortorgskällaren - a restaurant in the Old Town, serving classic dishes with a modern touch.

Day 5 | Friday, 22 August

Drottningholm Palace and Millesgården

Begin your day with **a scenic boat ride to Drottningholm**, a UNESCO World Heritage site and **the private residence of the Swedish royal family**. Upon arrival at Drottningholm, explore the magnificent Drottningholm Palace, inspired by the French Versailles. Wander through the lush gardens, visit the grand palace rooms, and don't miss the exquisite **Drottningholm Court Theatre**, one of the best-preserved 18th-century theaters in the world.

You take a bus back to the city for lunch at Orangeriet. Located on the picturesque Norr Mälarstrand, this restaurant offers a cozy ambiance with views of the water.

After lunch we head to the **Millesgården**, created in the early 20th century as a home and studio for world-renowned Swedish sculptor Carl Milles (1875-1955), and his wife, artist Olga Milles (1874-1967). The extensive, terraced park contains flower-adorned terraces and **around 100 of Carl Milles' sculptures**.



Day 5 | Friday, 22 August

Orangeriet

Orangeriet in Stockholm is **a stylish waterfront restaurant** known for its vibrant atmosphere and scenic view of the Knights' Bay. It offers a diverse menu blending Swedish and international flavors, set in a cozy, greenhouse-inspired interior with lush greenery and natural light.
